Note 1.

During each year projects approved earlier and frequently part funded are not always completed or draw down payments during that year.

Note 2. RJLP Trustees currently have 44 projects under active development with forecast costs of (£330221). Anticipated funding of (£210028 inc Reserves) is already targetted by the Managers. The necessary work continues in order to maintain the level of financial support required to continue this needy and ongoing work.

A Summation of the Projects Carried out through the work of the RJLP Trustees & Managers

A proportion of Projects are directly funded by clubs and organisations or attract TFR Matching Grants. These funds are not shown in RJLP Accounts. The Leh-Kargill Project alongside is typical with just **£4000**, as included above, of the actual **£11620** cost. The overall effect and the value to the patients of the work undertaken by is therefore significantly higher than the Accounts can show.

HOW YOUR MONEY WAS SPENT

SOME OF THE MAJOR PROJECTS COMPLETED IN 2006-7

The Jaipur Centre The place where it all began. Where, as the Mahaveer Society for the Physically Handicapped, the RIBI Rotarians responsible for creating the Rotary Jaipur Limb Project first saw how their club members could do so much to help. The Society Centre is the place where the technology and the fitting processes was developed and introduced. Funds donated from the Rotary Jaipur Limb Project has been instrumental in helping further development and in contributing to the cost of operations. We have, for many

years, made an annual donation of £10,000 from unrestricted funds and latterly to use that to cover the cost of one months operation.



February 2007 was the latest chosen month. The picture shows a small group of those treated at the centre. However it was NOT a SMALL group who received new limbs. The number treated was **565** including a boy of 5, an old man of 90 and 64 females. **An actual cost of just £17.70 each for a new Life**

One of the month's recipients was 28year old **Jamuni Devi** following a car accident. Despite 3 operations, and 6 months as a hospital patient in Uttar Pradesh, the leg was amputated. Driven to Jaipur, the new leg provided now allows her to function without trace of disability. She now earns around 100Rs/day from telephonic equipment provided by the Centre for her re-habilitation.

Just one of that months work for the technicians who, during **2006-7**, were responsible for fitting **20,475** limbs. Jaipur trained technicians working in other countries fitted some **15,333** limbs too. Another year's great achievement for the Jaipur Centre and the other Centres and Limb Camps supported by the Rotary Jaipur Limb Project through the continuing generosity of RIBI Club members and their communities.



Leh-Kargill Mobility Camp in the War Zone some 12,000ft up on the Indo-Pakistan border - 21st to 27th Sept. 2007. Managed by Mahendra G. Metha of the Rotary Club of Bombay (D3140); that club organised one of the fully equipped vans to travel from Mumbai to allow fully trained Technicians to fit calipers and Jaipur prosthetics. There are no Rotary Clubs in the area but local organisations provided administration and wonderful support. A total of **539** beneficiaries are now mobile and able to lead a more normal life.

The project cost was £11620

Funded by the Ratna Charitable Trust £2870, a German Medical Charity £4750 and the Rotary Jaipur Limb Project donation of £4,000 .

Jan '07. A mega limb camp held by RC Bangalore Peenya where 2400 beneficiaries from Bangalore and local villages were treated. 100+ children and young adults were also identified and are now being treated with reconstructive surgery by volunteer surgeons at Ramiah Hospital as a separate project. The Cost £15300. **Just £6.40 each new life.** Funds:- RC York Vikings & twinned RC Munster (Germany) - £4850, D1130 - £2050, a non-Rotarian - £2400. RC Bangalore Peena and local sponsors - £5100 with a small balance from RJLP unrestricted funds.

Later a Spring '07 project supplied 100 wheel chairs and 94 tricycles to those unable to be helped at previous camps. Funded by 13 RIBI clubs - £7929. TRF Matching Grant - £4500. Locally the club and their sponsors added further funds to supply 40 more wheel chairs and 40 more tricycles. **Another wonderful 'International Rotary' input**

New 4x4 for two Jaipur Centres in Kampala, Uganda.

Ford Ranger Double cab pickup costing **£16,750.00**, financed by RC Lymington, DDF from D 1110 and a TRF matching grant. Delivered to its base at St Francis Hospital, Buluba, in Jan 07 and seen here being 'cleaned' by visiting Trustee PDG Don Short and his wife Rosemary. The vehicle will enable JPL Technicians at Buluba and Kumi to visit outlying villages, undertake minor adjustments/repairs, or bring patients in to the workshops for more substantial work or new limbs. It will also serve as an off-road ambulance for these two former Leprosy Mission hospitals deep in rural Uganda.



How it all Happens! A story from Tanzania

Firstly, we were told of a boy in Bukoba, who had lost both legs in a fall. Could we help? We could - and did. Roger Chigara is now back at school, walking on his two Jaipur limbs. **It is not the end of the story.** Bukoba is a remote town on the shores of Lake Victoria with, fortunately, a small Rotary Club. Working with Rtn. Raza Fazel we were able to arrange for Roger, **and six other amputees**, to travel to the large workshop managed by RC Nairobi South. Whilst in Africa, Trustee Don Short travelled to Bukoba to meet some of the seven patients gathered to thank the Rotarians of RIBI. Equally important, to discuss setting up a new Jaipur Limb Centre there to serve this NE part of Tanzania - **Watch this space! Another value for money story.**

Kano - Nigeria—The Ade Majiyagbe Memorial Centre

Prior to Jonathan Majiyagbe becoming the first African President of RI, his beloved wife, Ade Majiyagbe, died of a heart attack. Jonathan and Ade had regularly donated money to provide artificial limbs for poor amputees in their State of Kano. Clubs and Districts in RIBI generously supported the RJLP trustees initiative to establish a Jaipur Limb workshop in the area as a memorial. The project involved the conversion an abandoned building into a self-contained orthopaedic workshop to serve this huge northern state of Kano. Funding led by RC Hamble Valley & many RIBI clubs together with DDF from several RIBI Districts and a matching grant from the Rotary Foundation, the total cost of building works, equipment, materials (for an initial 500 limbs) and staff training totalled **£25,400.00**. The new centre was finally opened for business in June 2007.

The staff of this new facility are now capable of making and fitting two or three new limbs each day at an average cost of £20.00 - compared to their previous production rate of one limb per fortnight at a cost of £102.00 - for an unarticulated wooden leg. A truly dramatic change!

As shown below in the other projects completed the workshop in Gbagada funded by RC Newport Pagnell awaits staff training and material supplies. Another great opportunity created to aid the disabled in this region.

The Permanent Rotary Jaipur Limb Centre at Vijayawada, India.
 The first stage of the project to complete the building was achieved with a major contribution from the Rotary Club of Birmingham who had been given a legacy of £10,000. They requested the Centre be named the "RC of Birmingham Ronald Crocker Centre" in memory of a late relative of PDG Tom Cryer. Costing some £17,000, the balance was achieved from innumerable donations to the RJLP from Rotary and Inner Wheel clubs in RIBI. Visited recently by Trustee PDG Colin James who reports that the building and fittings are to a high standard. For the second stage the centre awaits the provision of trained technicians the final equipment and the materials, all expected in the immediate future. 😊
